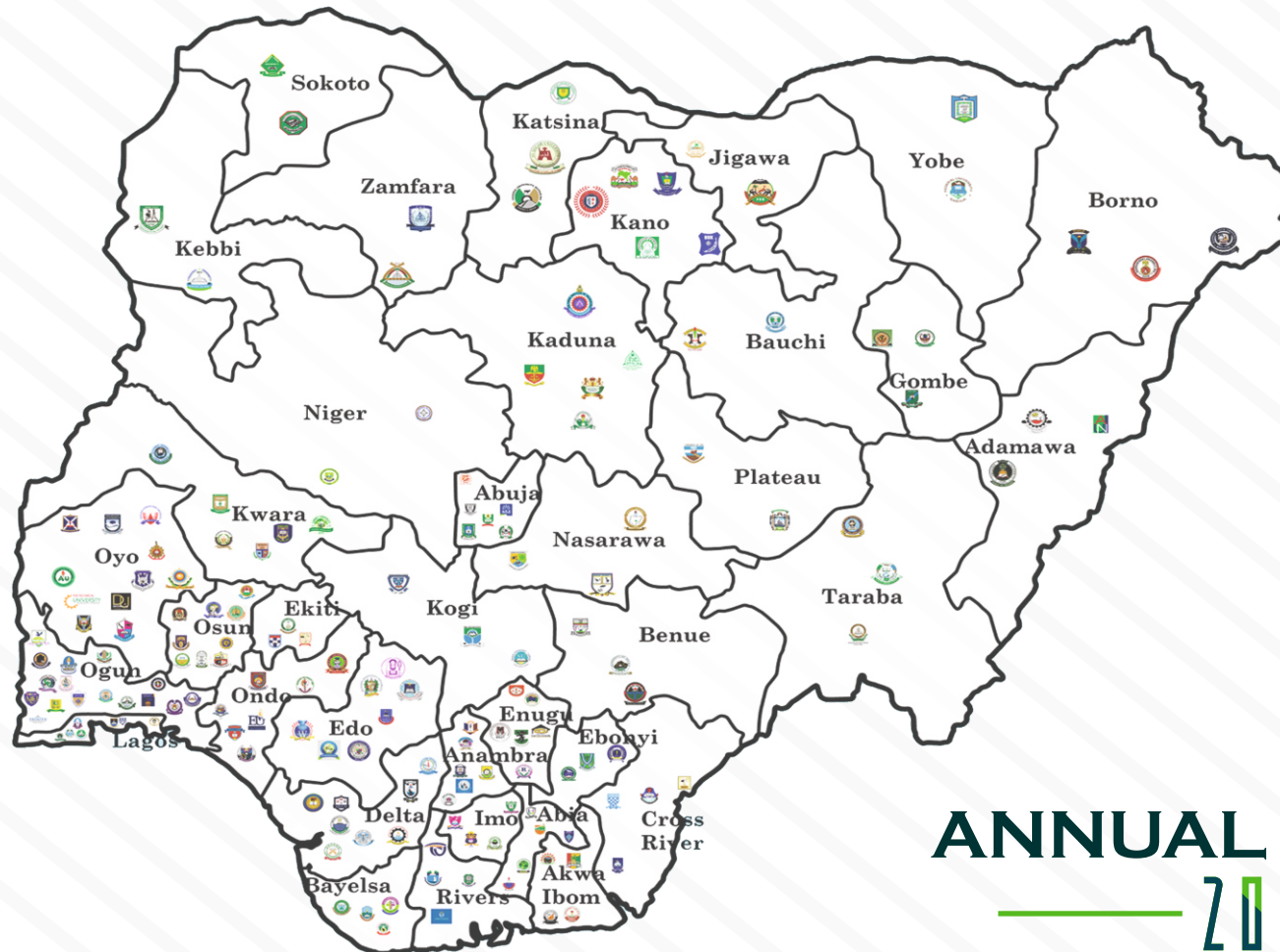

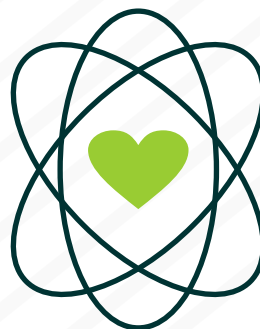

Office Maintenance

1. The office supervised the construction of an overhead tank in the office premises at Wuse 2.
2. Upgrade of office paraphernalia such as window blinds including the refurbishment of some chairs in staff offices, the Committee room and the Conference Hall were carried out

Hall Rentals

The office rented out the Conference Hall and Committee room to various clients from January to October to the tune of Seven Million Six Hundred and Ninety Thousand (N7, 690,000.00) naira only

Staff Recruitment

1. A Chief Research Officer was hired to head the Research Department and has since resumed duty.
2. Three (3) members of staff were recruited on contract basis into the Eaglescan Unit as Web Developer, Data Analyst and Marketer.
3. A Communications Officer was recruited to man the newly created Communications unit.
4. A Sport Media/Marketing Officer was recruited into the NUGA unit.
5. Three (3) Corp members were engaged to assist in the Research, Projects and Eaglescan Departments.

Staff Welfare

1. At the beginning of the year, the office engaged the Nigeria Centre for Disease Control (NCDC) to test secretariat staff for Covid-19, 5 staff tested positive and were sent for treatment accordingly.
2. The Secretariat introduced the payment of a yearly medical allowance package to all staff. Payment was made in two instalments at beginning and end of the end.
3. 100% Upward review of DTA and travel allowance for all staff was proposed,

approved and implemented as seen below;

4. The office resumed payment of annual leave allowance to all staff.
5. The payment of 13th month bonus salary at the end of the year was introduced and approved for payment.

Staff Training/Workshop ■

1. In the month of June 2021, the Crusader Sterling Pension Fund Administration group held a lecture session with CVC Secretariat Staff to discuss recent pension industry updates and attend to staff complaints on pension issues.
2. A four- day workshop on the topic 'Driving Procedures' was held from the 1st July 2021 at the Secretariat to further educate office drivers on road signs, and client safety.
3. Intermediate and Junior staff training on Contemporary Office Management Practice in the New Normal was delivered by the Centre for Development Management (CMD) on the 7th October 2021 .The training which took place at the CVCNU Conference Hall at 4, Parakou Street Wuse 2 was designed to align participants with the vision, mission and strategic direction of

the CVCNU Secretariat, build capacity to confront and manage change in the 'new normal' and to develop skills to meet up contemporary office management and best practice. Topics treated at the various sessions included; Understanding your Work Environment, Conflict Management in the Workplace and 'Security Consciousness in the Workplace'. Midway into the training the participants were broken into groups to demonstrate team building and knowledge collaboration. At the end of the training, an interactive question and answer session and take-away lessons summed up the program. Certificates of participation were given to the attendees.

Challenges/Recommendations ■

While the Department wishes to appreciate the Secretary-General for his kind approval of welfare packages for staff including the staff leave allowance despite the organisation's financial situation, the following are some challenges and recommendations for consideration;

1. Funding
 - Due to financial constraint, the Office is yet to procure the below items;
 - The Secretariat requires more of chairs (50) and replacement of the old ones especially in the conference hall and the

committee room

- A storage space to safely keep office items
- CCTV camera is needed in the office premises and open-use places such as the conference hall as this will help secure the environment and aid investigation and recovery of items in case of theft as unfortunately recorded at one event.
- The department recommends that at least one or two members of staff from each department attend an Individual and specialized training for staff in their respective careers or area of office duties/job specialization in a year.
- The Secretariat needs an Internal Auditor
- We also recommend that pension deductions should be remitted regularly

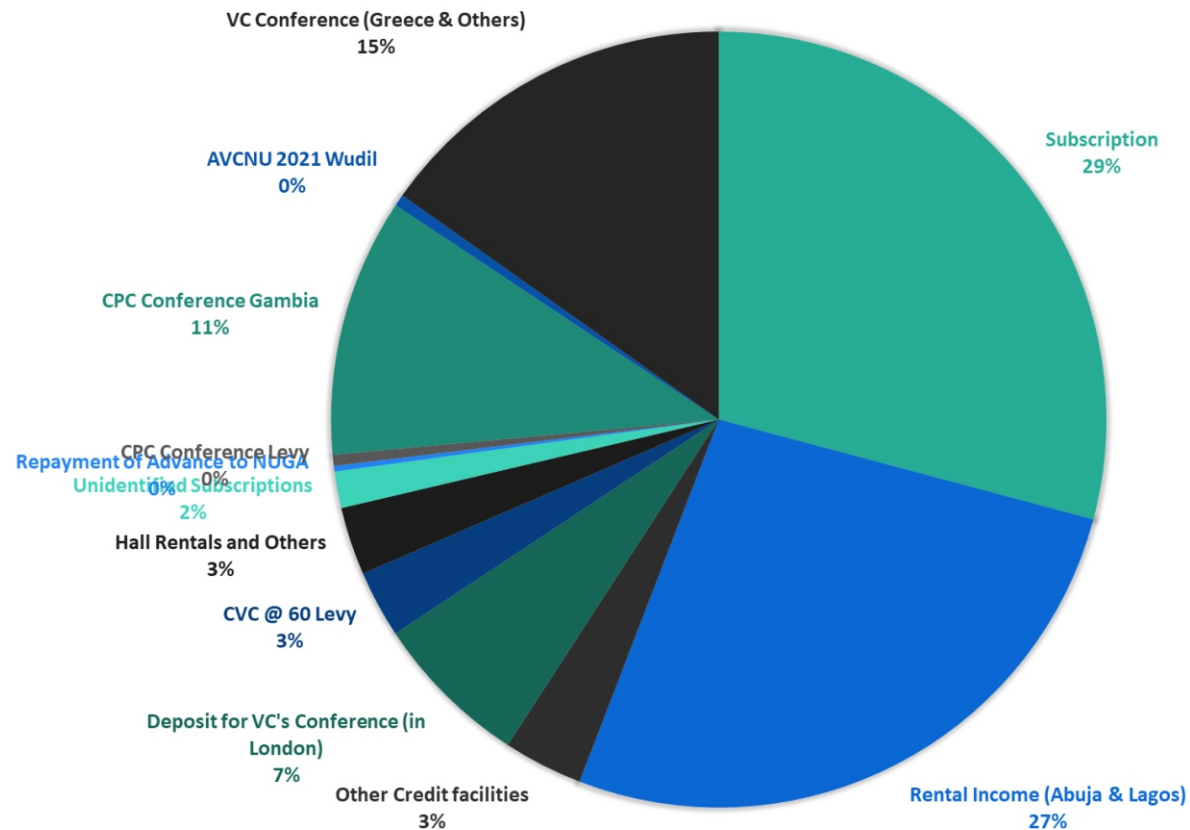

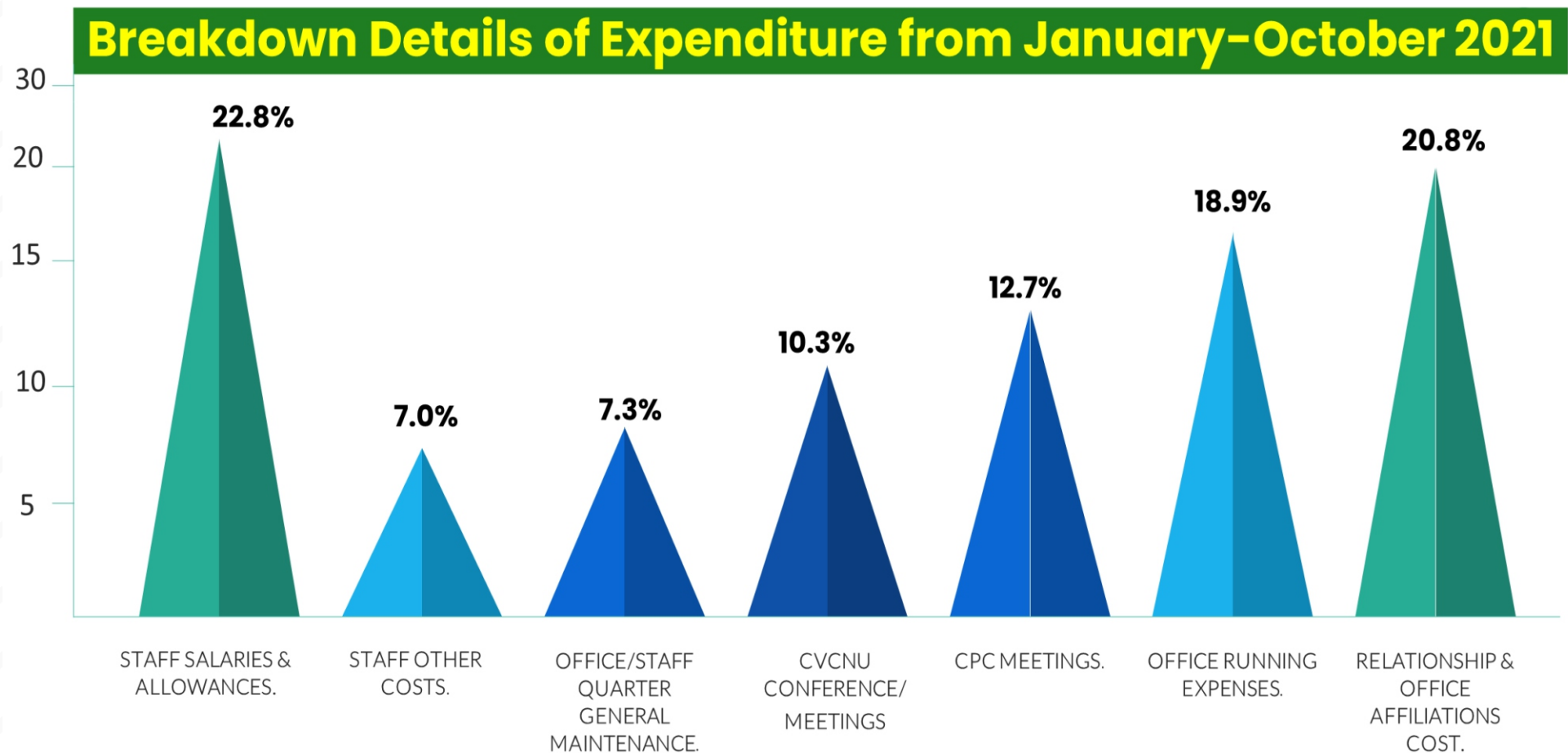

Investment and Business Development Unit

The unit has developed a number of business plans and forged partnership with companies. Below are details of activities embarked by the unit:

1. CVCNU has signed an MoU with Uni-Homes Nigeria Limited on the 22/3/2021 to build affordable housing for university students Accommodation needs.
2. A Business plan has been drafted to venture into Bamboo & Sugarcane business the secretariat is in discussion with the Central Bank of Nigeria and NIRSAL for funding, also meeting with the National Sugar Development is being courted with the DG NSDC.
3. The Secretariat is in discussion with Karmod Nigeria Limited fabricated Technologies Mc Daan Int'l to develop Eco-friendly Modular Cabins as Student Hostel & Administrative Buildings for our universities, with solar electricity provision including a pay easy laptop scheme for students
4. We have partnered with Daas Teknix to provide mobile devices to Nigerian universities, this is to simplify access to e-learning by providing smart tablets to staff and students at a flexible payment plan.
5. The CVCNU signed an MoU with Reticulated Global limited on the 20th April 2021, to develop the CVCNU land at Wuye, all paper work is completed and work on this project has commenced its full course.
6. Discussions are still ongoing with Eco-Path limited Germany on lowering printing cost and entrenching sustainability in our universities. The company presented its observation of Universities large spending on paper and reprographic consumables like toner, ink cartridges and photocopying papers. The business idea is a process to convert used paper to the new, re-useable paper.

This report details activities carried out by TPSD from January-October, 2021

1. DIGITIZATION OF OFFICE OPERATIONS

Following the recommendation of management for the department to take-over the digitization of office operation from Raadaa Partners, the department had since commenced the process in February. By the third quarter, the department in collaboration with the Account department, Human Resource, and General Administration initiated the design and development of accounting software. Accordingly, the Payroll software was completed successfully in August and is currently in use. Also, the account software is 80% completed as well.

2. PROVISION OF NEW AND UPGRADE OF EXISTING FACILITIES

The department has acquired new equipment including; 1 Internet Radio for improve internet experience, 5 Laptops for

members of staff, 3 All-in-One computers for account department, 1 Wireless Projector for the conference Hall, 2 wireless Microphones for the conference Hall, and 5 Uninterrupted Power Supply (UPS) for some offices.

3. COMPLETION OF EAGLESCAN ANTI-PLAGIARISM PLATFORM

The Eaglescan plagiarism detection software was completed and successfully launched in April, 2021. The platform has been open for public use since its launch in April. The event had in attendance, the Vice-President, Federal Republic of Nigeria, Prof. Yemi Osinbajo, The Minister of Education, Mallam Adamu Adamu, the Deputy Chairman, Senate Committee of Tertiary Education, Prof. Sandy Onor, The Executive Secretary, Nigerian Universities Commission, Prof. Abubakar Adamu Rasheed, Executive Secretary, Tertiary Education Trust Fund, Prof. Suleiman Elias Bogoro, Registrar, Joint Admission and Matriculation Board, Prof. Ishaq Oloyede, Vice-chancellors, Research Institutes and Centres, the Media, and the general public. The software was warmly received and recognized as a milestone towards improving University and indeed higher education in Nigeria and Africa at large.

Reviews are currently being collated and analysed for better service provision. The total number of users as at September is reached **3,247** cutting across **123** Universities. There are

687,337 documents indexed on the Eaglescan repository. The commercial phase is projected to start in October, 2021 after all necessary documentation and registration with Government agencies and financial institutions is completed.

The Technology Projects and Services Department also presented a report on Eaglescan Plagiarism Detection software during the AVCNU Conference in Wudil, Kano. The report presented to the Vice-Chancellors highlighted key performance indicators of the software post-launch from April through July. These included; its overall usage, effectiveness, ease-of-use, and the general recommendations by Users. The report also highlighted the spread of users. That is, the number of Users viz-a-viz each University, documents uploaded and certificates downloaded.

4. UPGRADE OF THE ASSOCIATION'S WEB PORTAL

The Association's web portal is currently being upgraded. New features include interactive map, real-time information on universities, improved look and feel etc. The web portal is 80% completed.

PROJECTS AND PROGRAMMES

This report covers projects, trainings and stakeholders' engagements the department has successfully implemented in 2021 and the Plan for the last Quarter of 2021.

Trainings, Workshops, Master Class and Conferences

1. Workshop recommendations: Master Class on Managing University's Enterprises for Improved Growth and Profitability in Creative Industries 16-18 March 2021 in Abuja

The workshop was well attended by Vice Chancellors, Directors of Universities Business Ventures, and Finance Officers of Nigerian Universities. A total number of 56 participants attended. Profit for CVC after workshop expenses: N1, 450, 000. The workshop ended on the 18th of March, 2021 with the following recommendations:

The University- owned investment company should embrace new concept of Build, operate and run, where the University shall hold equity in special purpose vehicle with prospective investor for such infrastructural Development.

The University – Owned investment company should as a matter of urgency migrate to International Financial Reporting Standard in order to attract external funding. The CVC shall midwife the migration and on-site training for the staff of the investment company with HEZAB as consultant.

The University –Owned Investment Company should open up their businesses and researches to outside world by attending international trade fair which would be facilitated by CVC.

The Secretary General of CVC should meet the management of Nigeria Investment Promotion Council, Federal Inland Revenue Service, Central Bank of Nigeria and Federal Ministry of Trade and Investment for tax incentive Export quota e.t.c. that will facilitate trade and attract investment by creating investment Hub within University communities.

The CVC should initiate a process whereby Universities can come together to form an SPV in order to jointly own a business venture. (Waste and intravenous fluid production was mentioned).

The CVC Secretary General should meet CBN and advocate for cheaper funding in order to attract investment for university communities.

The need to consolidate all businesses of University of Ilorin into one SPV for synergy and minimizing overlapping in line with international best practice.

Olabisi Onabanjo University, Ago Iwoye, though has a robust financial statement through patronage caused by high population within the university communities but could perform better if the investment is strictly run like a private sector and minimize government intervention in the governance, finance and audit process. The CVC is encouraged to initiate discussion with the University on how to restructure the investment.

All University-Owned investment companies are not profitably run except two or three universities that attended programme. The CVC will initiate the visit of the consultant to look at each of the university and proffer solution based on peculiarity of each university but in line with international best practice in order to achieve the ideal investment company within the University community.

2. International Workshop on Strategic Governance of Universities for Global and Local Relevance 28th June – 2nd July, 2021, in Cambridge, United Kingdom

The international workshop was attended by 12

Vice-Chancellors, 2 Pro-Chancellors and 7 Principal officers of Nigerian Universities.

Outcome: Participants received eye opening lectures on how to bridge the gap between university teaching and industry, Understanding the mandate, autonomy and governance of world class institutions using University of West England as a case study,

Global funding initiatives, increasing institutional research income other relevance topics. The workshop ended with a courtesy visit to the Nigeria House in the UK. The team was well received by the Ambassador of Nigeria to the United Kingdom, the Ambassador also took the opportunity to organize a strategic partnership meeting between the CVCNU and Universities UK International (UUKI).

3. The 35th Conference of the Committee of Vice Chancellors of Nigerian Universities (Annual Conference) July 11-14th. 2021

The 35th Conference of Association of Vice-Chancellors of Nigerian Universities (AVCNU) with the theme, “PATHWAYS TO GREEN INVESTING, CREATIVE FUNDING & DARQ TECHNOLOGIES

IN NIGERIAN UNIVERSITIES”, held from 11th to 14th July 2021. It was chaired by the Pro-Chancellor KUST, Malam A. B. Mahmud SAN, OON and declared open by His Excellency, The Executive Governor of Kano State, Abdullahi Umar Ganduje who was represented by the Secretary of the State Government Alhaji Usman Alhaji (Wazirin Gaya). The conference was attended physically by Sixty-One (61) Vice Chancellors and their spouses and Fourteen (14) Vice Chancellors virtually. In addition, thirty (30) delegates also attended physically and virtually. During the opening ceremony the Honourable Commissioner for Higher Education, Kano State, Dr. Mariya Mahmud Bunkure, the Honourable Minister of Education, NUC, CBN, Tetfund, JAMB, Committee of Pro-Chancellors of Federal Universities, NCCE, NBTE, Conference of Alumni Association of Nigerian University, and AWAU presented Good will messages. The keynote address was delivered by Professor Ibrahim Garba, a former Vice Chancellor, KUST Wudil and the immediate past Vice Chancellor of Ahmadu Bello University (ABU), Zaria. Experts from Industry and Academia led participants in Master Classes, Discussion Groups and Soap Boxes. Arising from the deliberations, the

following are recommendations that were made:

- ❑ Nigerian Universities should change to reflect current realities of 21st century.
- ❑ Nigerian Universities should setup action plan on green campuses to access opportunities on low-cost carbon development.
- ❑ Nigerian Universities should explore opportunities in green investments such as, date palm farming, snail farming, bike rental programme, exploring opportunities in alumni, philanthropists and other sources.
- ❑ The Nigerian Universities should strengthen linkages and collaborations with industries through research fair, exhibitions and open days.
- ❑ The financing mix of Nigerian universities should be more creative, innovative and should involve active participation of private sector through PPP.
- ❑ The opportunities provided by innovative technologies such as DARQ should be utilized for smart classes, distance and open learning and so on.
- ❑ The Eagle scan plagiarism detection

software and repository developed by CVCNU should be deployed to all Universities in Nigeria at the beginning of the next Academic Session.

4. Nigerian Universities and Labour Laws Workshop for Pro-Chancellors in Abuja, Nigeria 20th-24th September 2021

The Secretariat recorded 54 participants. Papers presented at the workshop covered topics such as Federal Universities, applicable laws and conflict of laws, Mastering the Art of Price Negotiations, The Place of Arbitration and ADR in the Nigerian University System, Labour Laws and the Nigerian University System, Ministry of Labour and Employment's Experience in Resolving Trade Disputes in Nigerian Public Universities amongst others.

5. Executive Development Programme for Pro Chancellors in Banjul, Gambia 18th – 22nd October, 2021

The biannual Executive Development Programme for the Committee of Pro-Chancellors took place at the Coco-Ocean Resort Banjul, The Gambia. The secretariat recorded 34 participants in attendance. The theme of Programme is Strategic Thinking for Managing Challenging times and Creative Financing for Higher Education in Nigeria.

Programme Resolution: It was agreed that the legal frame work guiding the Nigerian Universities System was outdated and needed to be re-framed, Participants also agreed that Public Universities are underfunded and therefore there was need for the committee to meet with Mr President to discuss these issues and present him with a solution. It was also suggested that a similar programme focusing on both Vice-Chancellors and Pro-Chancellors should be organized in order to improve the working relationship between the Pro-Chancellors and the Vice-Chancellors. The outcome of the programme is a communique/roadmap for achieving these set goals and objectives. The number of participants was 30, and the total amount received 28,800,000

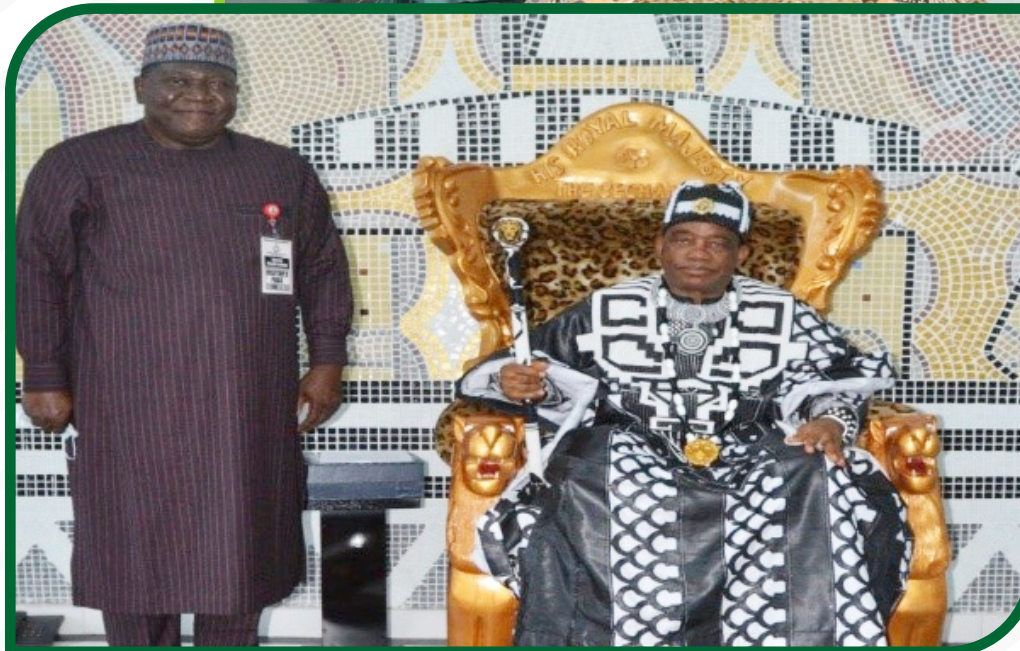

Activities From January to October 2021

VIRTUAL MEETING ON 31ST FISU GAMES

The International University Sports Federation (FISU) called for a Conference to discuss the issue and fashion a way forward. At the meeting where NUGA and over 80 other National University Sports Federations (NUSFs) participated, it was decided that the 31st FISU Games earlier scheduled to hold in Chengdu, China in August 2021 should be postponed till 2022.

FASU GENERAL ASSEMBLY AND STRATEGIC DIALOGUE

The 2021 General Assembly Federation of African University Sports (FASU) was held from March 24-28, 2021, at Addis Ababa in Ethiopia. Nigeria was represented at the programme by the NUGA President and the Secretary General prior General Assembly, the FISU/FASU/NUSF Strategic Dialogue was held. The host of the rescheduled 10th FASU Games also made a presentation

where he assured that all necessary facilities would be in place before the 10th FASU Games to be hosted by Kenyatta University of Science and Technology in April 2022. At a side event during the programme, the FASU President and the Secretary General had a meeting with the officials from the West African Sub-region.

At the meeting, the FASU President and Secretary General expressed his displeasure at the state of affairs in West African University Games Association (WAUG) where officials elected in year 2012 for a four-year tenure were still holding forth without any election. Consequently, an Interim WAUG Executive Committee was therefore formed as follows:

The Committee was charged to review the WAUG Constitution with a view to holding an Elective General Assembly of WAUG in

Conakry, Guinea on November 20, 2021. The review of the constitution is on-going.

VISIT TO TWO UNIVERSITIES IN LAGOS

The President and the Secretary General paid visit to the University of Lagos, Akoka and Lagos State University, Ojo between May 25 to 28, 2021.

At the University of Lagos, deliberations held with the Vice-Chancellor and the Local Organising Committee on the need to ensure that the 26th NUGA Games which provisional hosting rights had been granted to the University since year 2018 was actualized without further delay.

Furthermore, the issue of bidding to host the 11th African Universities Games in Nigeria in year 2024 was also discussed. At the Lagos State University, Ojo, the meeting with the Vice-Chancellor centered mainly on the need for the University to improve her sports facilities and build hostels on campus that could be used to host major sports competitions especially the

OLYMPIC VALUE EDUCATION PROGRAMME

The Olympic Value Education Programme for the year 2021 took place at three centres namely:

1. University of Uyo, Uyo July 14–17, 2021
2. Federal University of Technology, Akure –Sept. 26–29, 2021
3. Nile University of Nigeria, Abuja Sept. 29 to Oct. 2, 2021

In all 88 students from 80 Universities participated in the programme.

NIGERIA UNIVERSITY KARATE CHAMPIONSHIP

The Karate Federation of Nigeria (KFN) in collaboration with NUGA and the University of Ilorin successfully organized the 3rd Edition of the All-Nigerian University Open Karate Championship from August 9-12, 2021.

A total of 7 Universities with 71 competitors were accredited and competed in the Men's and Women's Kumite and Kata individual and team events.

The Nigerian Karate Referee Commission (NKRC) officiated at the event with 16 certified referees to maintain standard competition rules in line with the mandate of the World Karate Federation (WKF). The registration was done on the NUGA website to assure credibility of participating athletes. University of Benin came first with 8 gold medals, 6 Silver and 9 bronze medals, the University of Ilorin (host) was second with 5 gold medals, 4 silver and 10 bronze medals, Joseph Sarwuan University, Markudi finished in third place with one gold medal, the University of Abuja had 3 silver and 2 bronze medals place fourth, while Delta State University, Abraka finished fifth with 1 silver and 2 bronze medals. Ignatius Ajuru University of Education, Port-Harcourt and Kwara State University, Malete also participated in the competition.

INTERNATIONAL DAY OF UNIVERSITY SPORTS (IDUS)

The 2021 International Day of University Sports (IDUS) celebration for the Nigerian University Games Association was celebrated on the 29th of September 2021 at Nile University, Abuja alongside the planned lecture on Olympic Value Education Programme which is organized by the Nigerian Olympic Committee conjunction with Nigerian University Games

Association.

The Nile University Male Basketball team (“Nile Spartans”) made up both teams (except a basketball player from Ibrahim Babangida University, Lapai) took part in the basketball playoff event that entertained the OVEP participants, their fellow students and members of the University community. 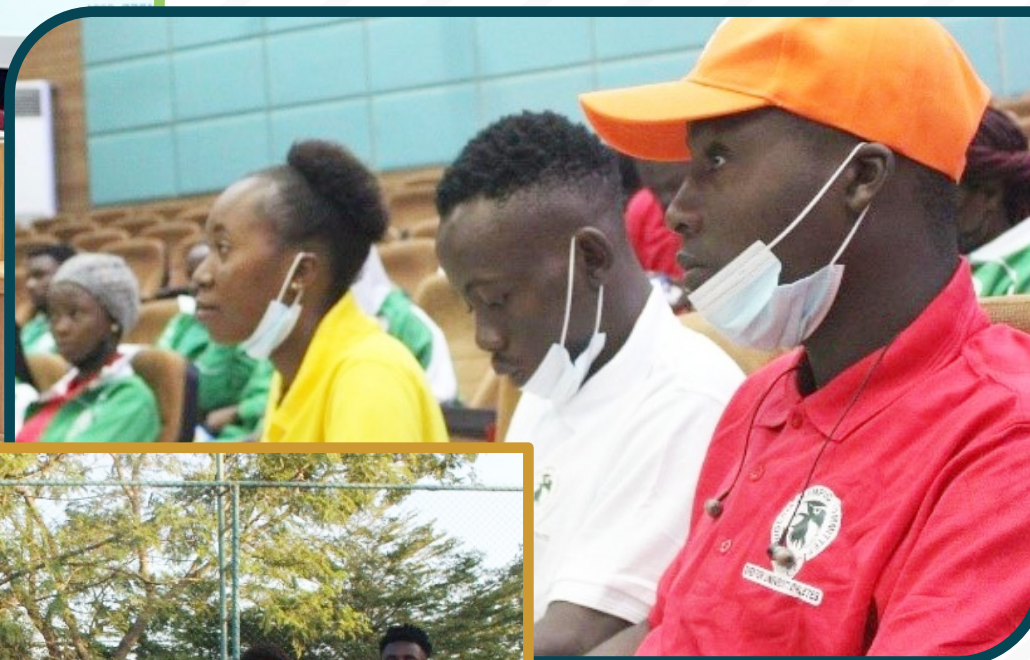
The fifth session “Structured Sports Programmes: An Avenue for Positive Engagement of Nigerian Youths” was

1. INTRODUCTION

Loan disbursement to members for various reasons started in the month of

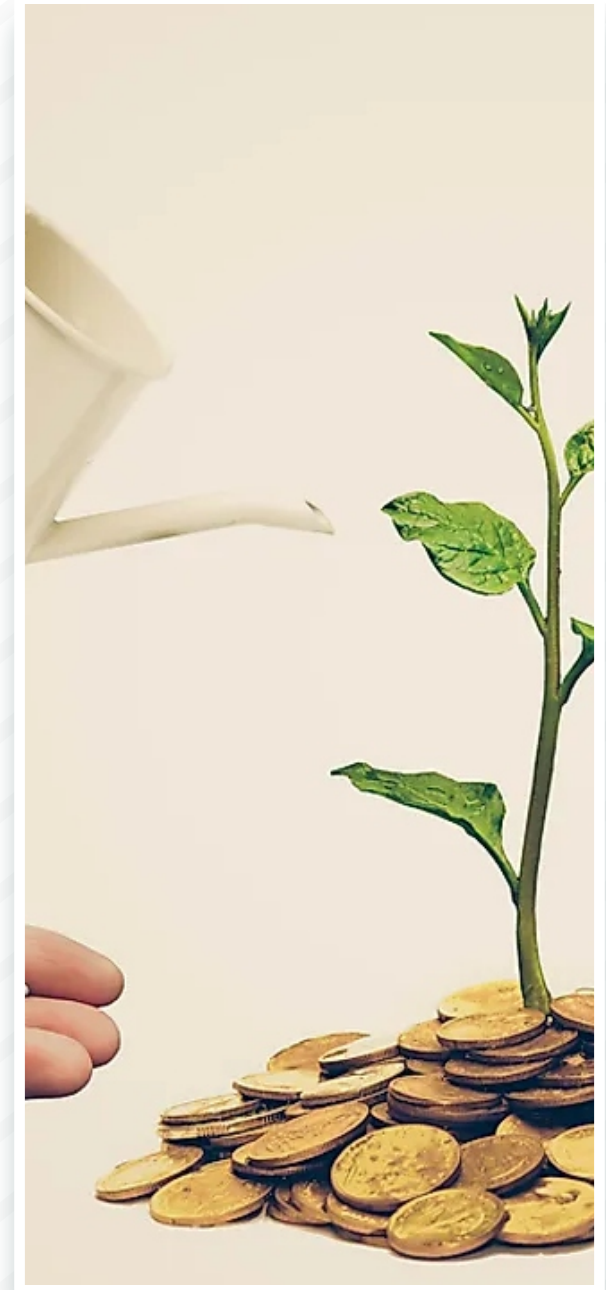
December, 2020 and this is on-going. A total of 28 beneficiaries have collected loans from the Cooperatives some more than once.

OVERHEAD TANK PROJECT

The overhead tank project which started early in the year is now completed. The following tanks were acquired 3000ltr, 5000ltr and 10,000ltr and the underground reservoir capacity has been improved, this was done to improve the pressure of water on the 1st and 2nd floor respectively

GENERATOR

The generators in the Secretariat and that of the Secretary-General residence are in good condition. Routine servicing was carried duly throughout the year. The generator developed a fault in June, 2021, and the water had to be fixed.

AEDC TOKEN

The AEDC token for both the secretariat and Secretary-General's residence are working well. Though there has been an upturn in electricity tariff, the Secretary-General approved an increase in the purchase of unit recharged for both the office and the official residence.

SERVICING OF AIR CONDITIONERS

All the secretariats air conditioning system are in good condition. The department attends to staff request and complain when fault arises and repair from that particular office. However, compressor of one of the units in the conference hall needs to be changed.

FIRE EXTINGUISHER

Servicing was carried out on all fire extinguishers in the office and residence of Management Staff.

WINDOW BLIND

We supervised the installation of the window blinds for all offices including the conference hall.

CVC RECEPTION

The department supervised the installation of a new 1.5hp LG A/C for the reception.

CONVERSION OF THE BACK ENTRANCE TO AN OFFICE

Conversion of the back CVC entrance to an office, the below picture shows the construction and the partitioning of the new office.
